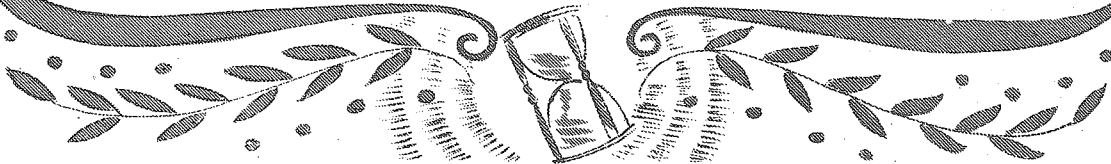


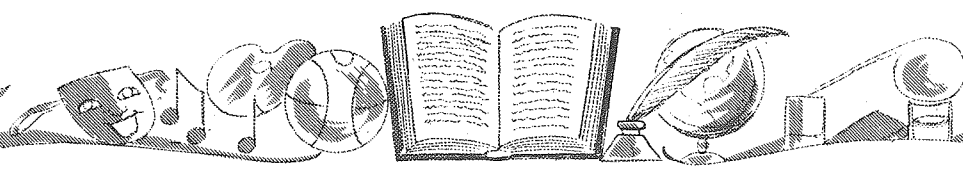


Class History

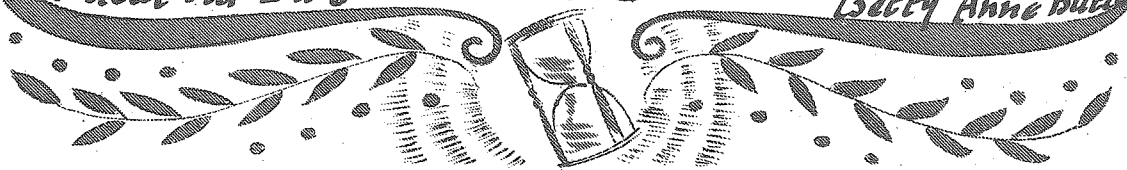


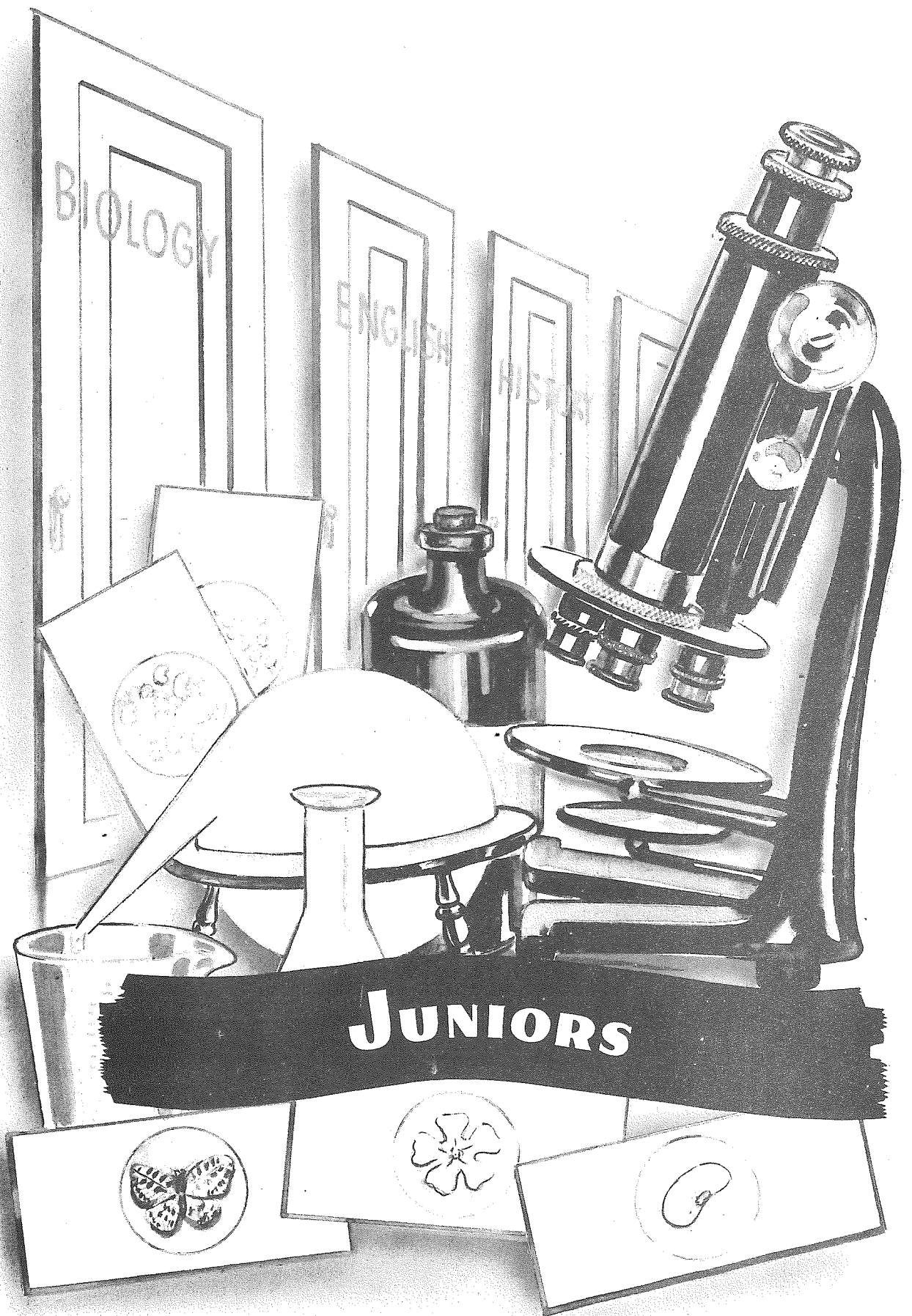
episode was the scrubbing of the walls by the Sophomore girls. This we will never forget! Athletics were still out and we missed their excitement.

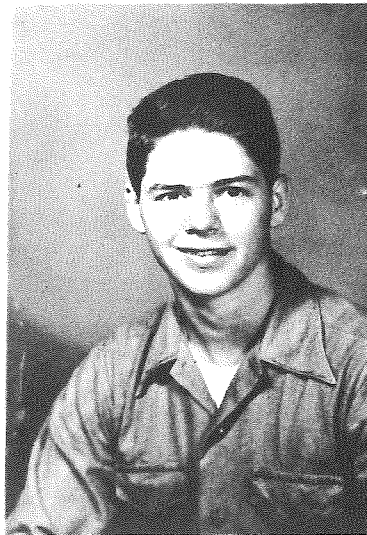
