DON CORN "the Everglades...an insider's view"

If you would like an idea as to what the Florida wilderness is like-visit the Collier County Museum during the month of July. The Don Corn exhibit should give you an idea of what the Everglades looks like through the photographs on display.

Don Corn's exhibit is titled, "the Everglades...an insider's view." Mr. Corn has been photographing the Everglades for the past five years. All photographs in the exhibition are black and white made with a 4 x 5 view camera. While his earliest photography experiences were with 35mm systems, his studies of other photographers' work eventually led him to the view-camera. With this format, photography



became alive for Mr. Corn and he began, he says, to learn to photograph all over again. For him the large format is more personal. The time element involved demands thought and awareness of each negative. In the Everglades he works alone, focusing all his energy and feeling into his photography.

"This selection of twenty B/W photographs are from a five year on-going project to show the glades in a different perspective from the view most people have of it," said Mr. Corn. "Being a native of Florida, I've grown up with the Everglades and learned about its beauty and quiet seasonal changes. As a photographer I've tried to photograph the glades, its changes and the quiet places that aren't seen by most people. Also I've come to understand why some people fear it, and why these same people try and tame this "River of Grass".

1. a.Copeland is named after D. Graham Copeland. As B.G.Coller's chief engineer he supervised the construction of the Tamiami Trail.
