FREE MOVIES AND LECTURES SCHEDULED AT THE MUSEUM

Museum Lecture Series

Wednesday Lectures at the Museum conclude November 7. Held at the Collier County Museum on the Courthouse Complex at 2 PM, they are free and cover a range of topics.

October 17th will explore Florida as the home of over thirty species of epiphytes orchids. From the cryptic "Ghost Orchid" to the common "Bee Orchid", this will be an interesting introduction into the arboreal world of these fascinating plants.

The seemingly monotonous Pine forest of Southwest Florida will be explored October 24th. Despite nutrient poor soil, long winter drought, inundating summer rain and regular ravages of fire, hundreds of species of finely adapted plants and animals make these woods one of the most diverse ecosystems in North America.

On October 31, attention turns from the Pine Forests to the Mangroves and Estuarine Ecosystem. SW Florida has the second largest mangrove forest in the world and you can learn about the specialized trees which make it up as well as the strange creatures that make their homes in it.

To mark the conclusion of the 2007 hurricane season a week later, on November 7th the Museum presents a Hurricane History of Southwest Florida. You'll learn how these storms shape the coastline and the major storms, which have impacted this area plus the climatic conditions, which result in serious threat to life and property ... or minor inconveniences.

MUSEUM OF THE EVERGLADES

The building which today houses the Museum of the Everglades in Everglades City first opened in 1927 as a commercial laundry in the days when construction of the Tamiami Trail was underway and the tiny settlement of Everglades served as both a frontier trading town and the County seat.

Permanent and traveling exhibits provide visitors with an in-depth look at 2,000 years of human history in the area and tell the story of adventurers stubborn enough to settle Southwest Florida's lush "River of Grass." Carefully restored to its 1920s appearance, the museum is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Museum Movie Matinees

The free films continue at the Collier County Museum on Saturday afternoons at 1 PM!

For the rest of the year, the films each month will have a common theme. In October, for instance, they are mysteries.

We opened with a Basil Rathbone classic, "Sherlock Holmes Faces Death", from 1943. On Saturday the 14th it's "Double Indemnity" (1944) starring Barbara Stanwyck and Fred MacMurray, directed by Academy Award winner Billy Wilder. On October 20th, come see "The Thin Man", the original from 1934 with William Powell and Myrna Loy starring as Nick and Nora Charles, private sleuths. The month closes on the 27th with "The Stranger" (1946) starring and directed by Orson Welles with Loretta Young and Edward G. Robinson.

November brings movies, which were popular during WWII and were about WWII. There will be films with many stars of that era who also served in the armed services.

December is all about the Oscar. You can do your Christmas shopping (including at the Museum's Gift Shop!) on Saturday morning and come watch an afternoon film that won Academy Awards during the 1940's.
