

Ocala National Forest Ranger Roll Call

History – Ocala National Forest is located in central Florida and covers about 600 square miles of springs and ponds. It was established in 1908, making it the oldest National Forest east of the Mississippi River, and named after a Timucuan term meaning “fair land.” Ocala National Forest is the southernmost National Forest in the contiguous U.S. and only comprised of two ranger districts: Lake George and Seminole.
