Cache National Forest

The Cache National Forest was first established as the Logan Forest Reserve in 1903. In 1905, the Reserve became the Bear River National Forest. The Bear River National Forest included the Bear River Range in Northern Utah and Southern Idaho. In 1907 the name was changed to the Cache National Forest with the Supervisors office in Logan, Utah. In 1973 the Cache was divided along state boundaries, the Utah districts forming the Wasatch-Cache National Forest with the Supervisors Office in Salt Lake City. The Idaho districts became part of the Cariboo National Forest with the Supervisors off in Pocatello, Idaho.

Wasatch National Forest

Wasatch Forest Reserve was established on August 16, 1906. On March 4, 1907 the Wasatch Forest Preserve became the Salt Lake National Forest. On July 1, 1908 the Grantsville National Forest was combined with the Salt Lake National Forest to become the Wasatch National Forest. In 1973 the Wasatch was combined with the Cache National Forest to become the Wasatch-Cache National Forest. The Wasatch- Cache was combined with the Uinta National Forest in 2007 to become the Uinta Wasatch-Cache National Forest

Kamas Ranger District:

2/1897 Kamas Ranger District part of the Uinta Forest Reserve later changed to Uinta National Forest in 3/1907. 6/1915 transferred Kamas District from Uinta National Forest to Wasatch National Forest. From 1897 to 1920 the Kamas District headquarters where in Lone Tree, Wyoming. 1920 the district office moved from Lone Tree, Wyoming to its current location in Kamas. 2/1929 the North Fork of the Duchesne River and Mirror Lake Region was transferred from the Uinta National Forest to the Wasatch National Forest and the Kamas District. The High Uinta Wilderness part of the district was added in 1955.
