The enclosed clipping was cut from the LOS ANGELES TIMES of December 1, 1945, which I have sent me, for my home has been all my life in Los Angeles.

Certainly the TIMES and the AP are in error in reporting the facts in this case. I do not believe in condemning people on the basis of newspaper stories, so would appreciate so much hearing the story officially. Four men have brought the matter to my attention and in each instance I have defended the American Legion, insisting that the Legion considers a soldier to be a soldier, not because of his race, but by his loyalty to our great American cause.

It will be a great personal satisfaction to me to be able to quote your letter to those who are severely criticizing the Legion for an action I am convinced no honest American could possibly take.
