OPEN NEW STATION TONIGHT

BRIEF PROGRAM STARTING AT EIGHT O'CLOCK FOLLOWED BY TWO-HOUR PUBLIC INSPECTION

Twenty-Five Santa Fe Officials Attending Opening Program: City and Chamber of Commerce Officials Will Speak

Tonight the Santa Fe officials will be hosts to the people of Monrovia and vicinity. The handsome new Monrovia station is finished and ready for public inspection and the people of Monrovia will show their appreciation of this new improvement by assembling there this evening at the invitation of the railroad officials.

A program will be given commencing at eight o'clock, Senator H.J. Evans, serving as chairman. This is a most appropriate selection as Senator Evans has been active in securing this modern station for his home city. David J. Unruh will lead in community singing and he will be reinforced by the best voices in Monrovia.

Thomas R. Hayes will represent the City of Monrovia and speak in the place of Mayor Arthur J. Everest, who is still convalescing from a recent illness. Frank J. Wood, president of the Chamber of Commerce, will express to the Santa Fe officials sentiments of appreciation for the new improvement. Responses will be made on the part of the Company by E.O. Bryan, of the Industrial Department; H.P. Anewalt, general freight agent, and R.H. Tuttle, superintendent of the Los Angeles division.

The Santa Fe, traversing the Navajo country, will feature some of their industrial characteristics for publicity purposes and the local agent, L.A. Fox, has artistically arranged an attractive collection of Navajo rugs and blankets, Indian baskets and pottery. Fred Harvey service, which has established a nation-wide fame for Santa Fe dining service, will offer light refreshments for the entertainment of the guests.

Monrovia has always had a friend in the person of Mr. Fox, who has been alert to the interests of the city and was the first to urge this improvement upon the Santa Fe officials. The large crowds that will assemble at this service will be a well deserved testimonial to Mr. Fox's friendly offices.
