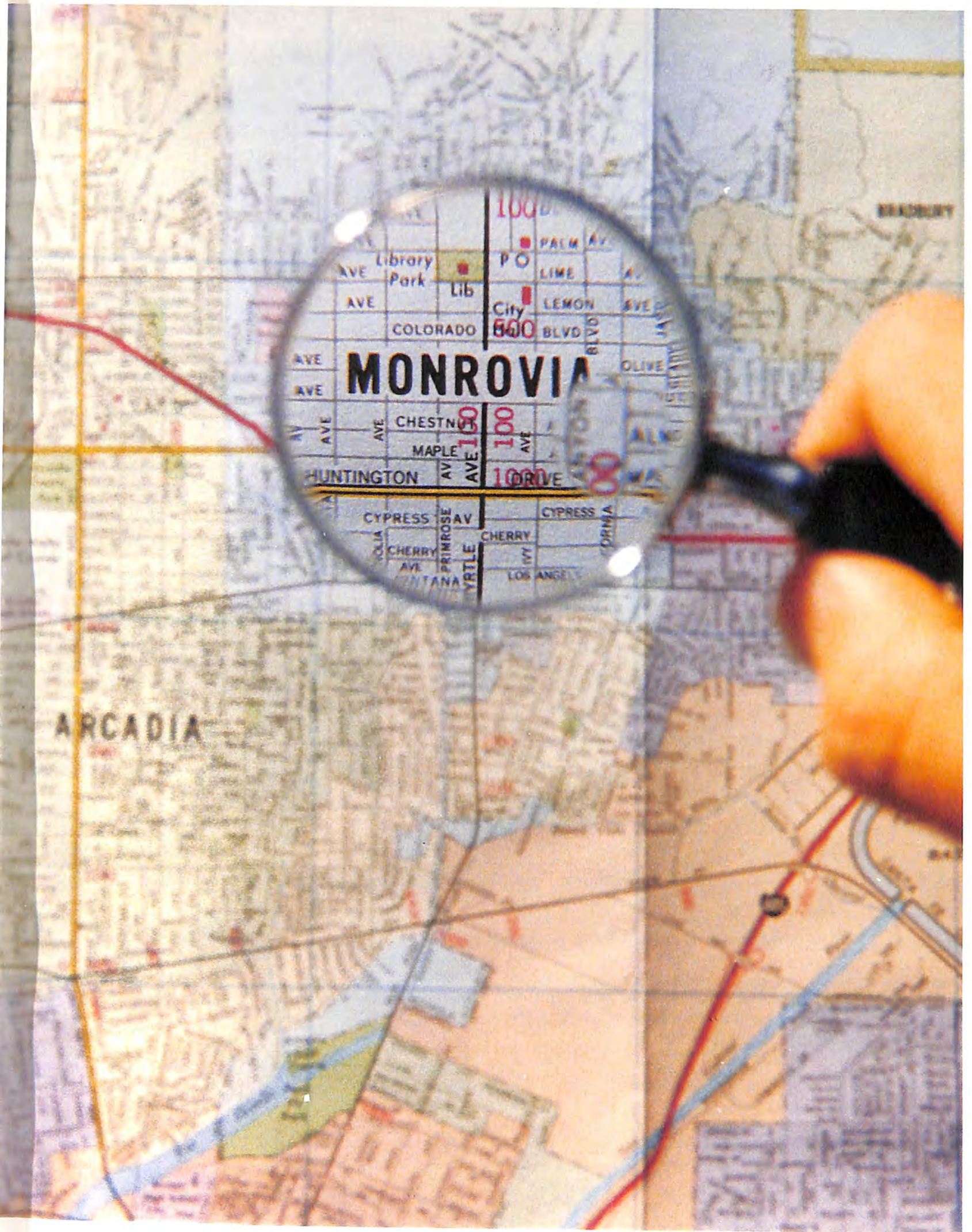

A Year In Quick Review

In conveying what Monrovia High has done this past year, it is hard to condense everything into one page. Monrovia High School has a long tradition of keeping its students educated and entertained.

This tradition showed in its 100th annual Homecoming Parade and Festivities Week, known locally for being one of the most extravagant parades. The ASB Cabinet revitalized its interest in the student body, and with enthusiastic members, helped coordinate events that sparked school spirit, including one of the most "involved" Togetherness Days the campus has had. Clubs participated in furthering of academic and cultural awareness, including the newly formed Multi-Cultural Club and the steadfast clubs such as the Scholarship Society, Monarcs and Madquins, The German Club, Unidos and Upward Bound, to mention only a few.

One not only enjoyed him or herself in a club, but other important activities for the school provided a release for students to enjoy themselves. Such activities that provided enjoyment included the Junior-Senior prom at the spacious Universal Sheraton Hotel, and activities that provided audio-visual excitement were the fall play, "Dracula" and the spring musical, "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown."

Monrovia's indomitable spirit shined through in its sports teams. Despite seasons of wins and losses, our teams performed boldly under the circumstances of trying hard yet not quite reaching the goal.

Academia played a major role in the students' lives this year. The newly installed House program progressed into its second year, now including most Freshmen and Sophomores. Certain Seniors were awarded Gold Seal Status for their academic excellence, and the National Honor Society inducted thirty members into this prestigious group. Nothing new, yet still important in the academic process were the constant essays and reading assignments for the English classes, the many assorted labs for the Science classes, and the seemingly impossible (yet solvable) math homework for the Math classes.

A Year Of Change

The 101st year . . . proved to be a time of beginnings

The 101st year of Monrovia High School proved to be a time of beginnings, but had its share of ends.

First and foremost, unlike most other schools in Southern California, MHS is still around and is beginning its next century of existence, working on improving on last year's yearbook quote, "One-tenth of a millennium done, nine-tenths left to go". MHS will complete those nine-tenths, but it takes one step at a time.

That philosophy is what the House program in Monrovia HS is based on. First introduced last year, the program is in its second stage, continuing the process of restructuring, when all Freshmen and Sophomores are part of what's called the House System.

A new institution that MHS students and faculty were introduced to this year was the new Wednesday schedule. While a good idea (getting out at 1:10 isn't bad), why couldn't the day have been on Friday? Friday being also a day which saw the end of its infamous E-Flag tradition.

Other ends that MHS encountered this year included times of great change.

Another sad end is that of Mr. Frank Jansson's decision to leave the Yearbook Staff. After over 30 years of dedicated service to providing the Monrovia campus a good yearbook, year after year, through the 60's, 70's, 80's and 90's, he relinquished the reins to Mr. Eric Miller.

The yearbook staff is instituting both a beginning and end to the Monrovia. The Monrovia is changing its direction from less interaction and information to a more current and journalistic yearbook. We hope that you, the reader, enjoy the new style, plus the new sections.

And finally, to see a much more detailed account of what has only been mentioned briefly in these few pages, you need only to turn the page. 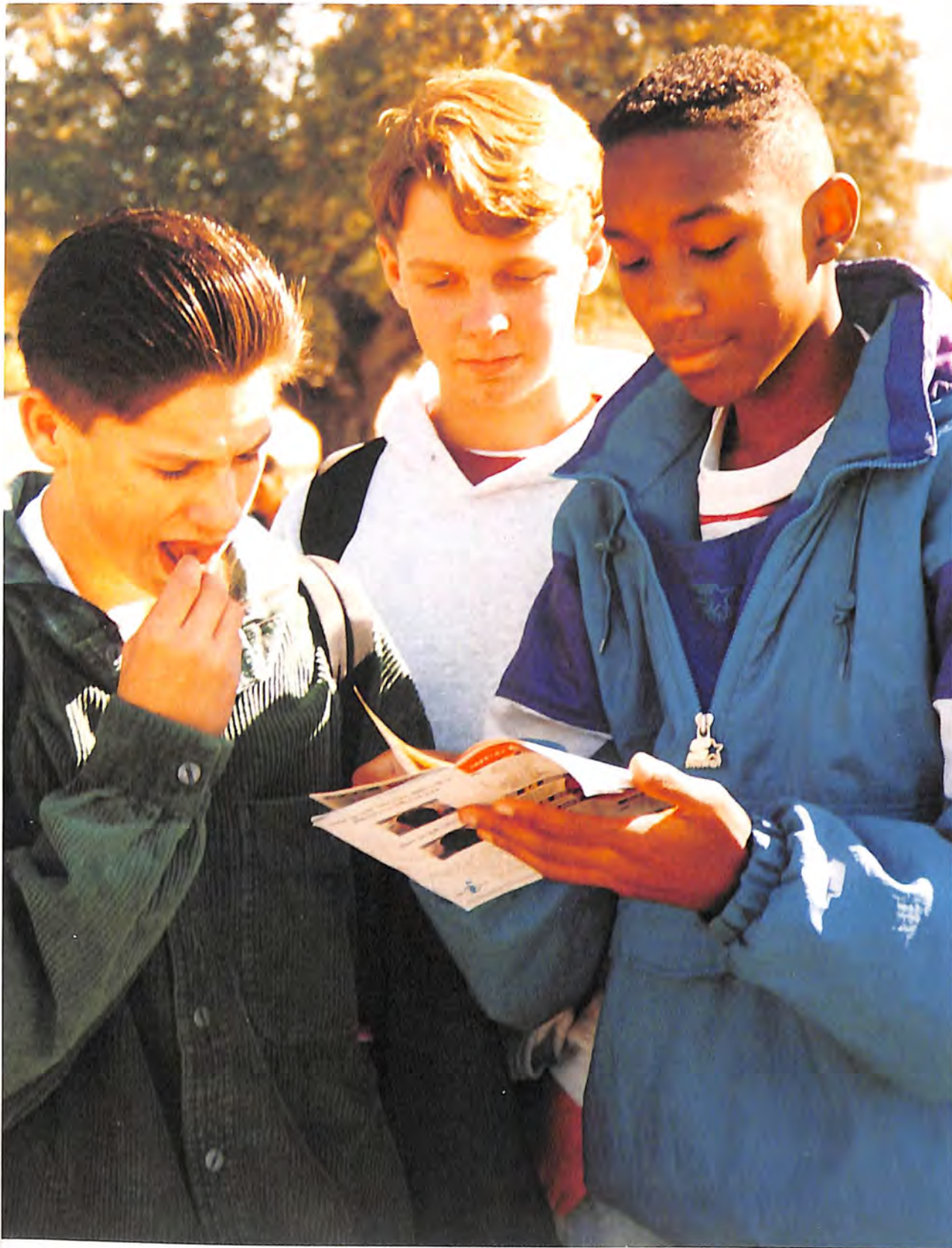

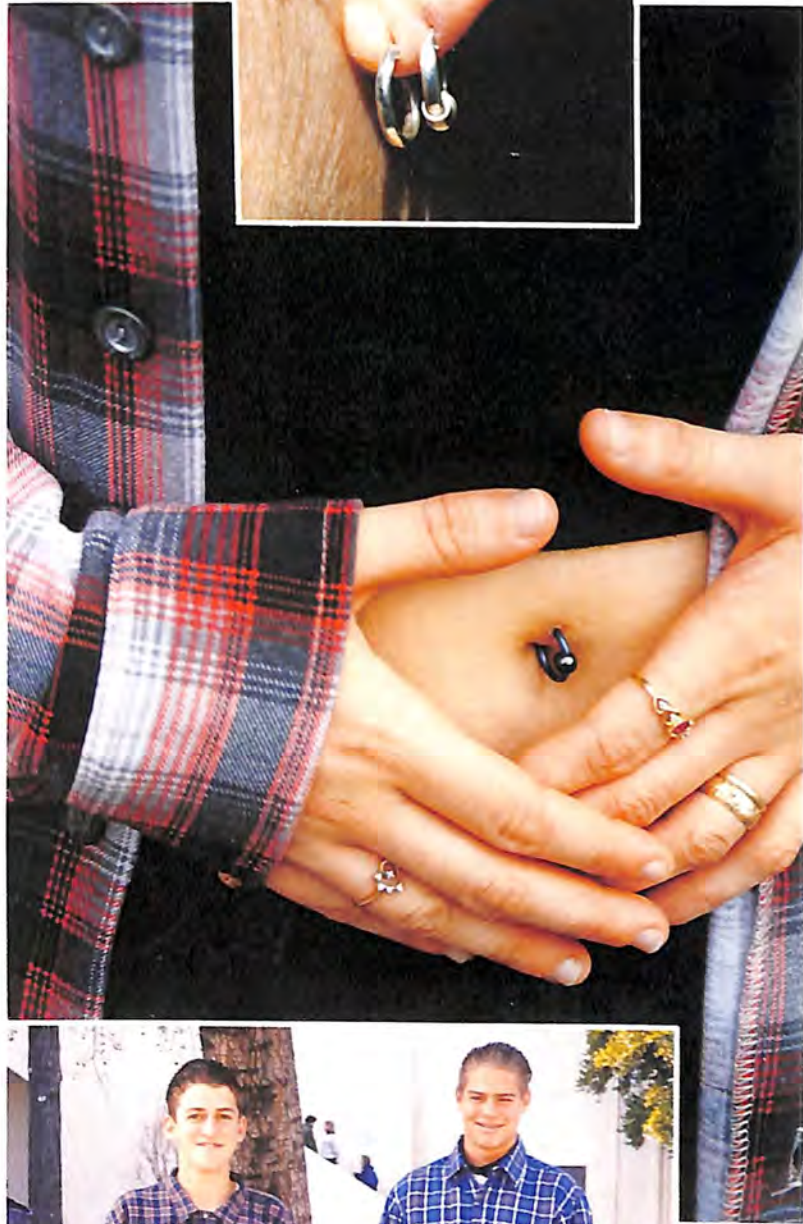

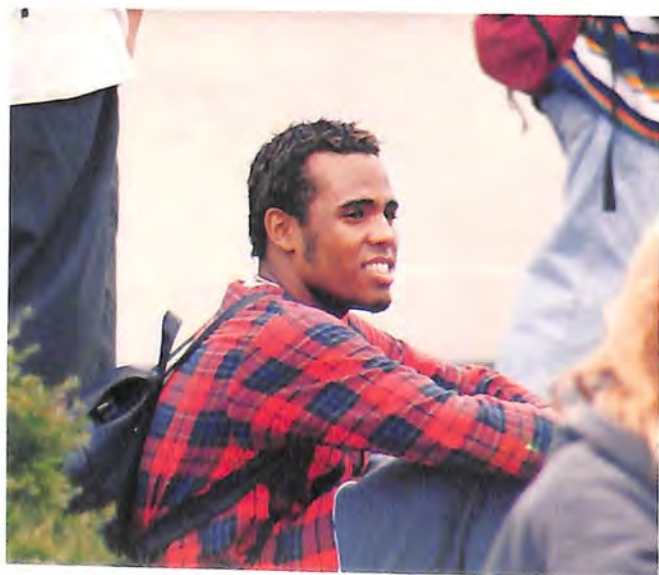

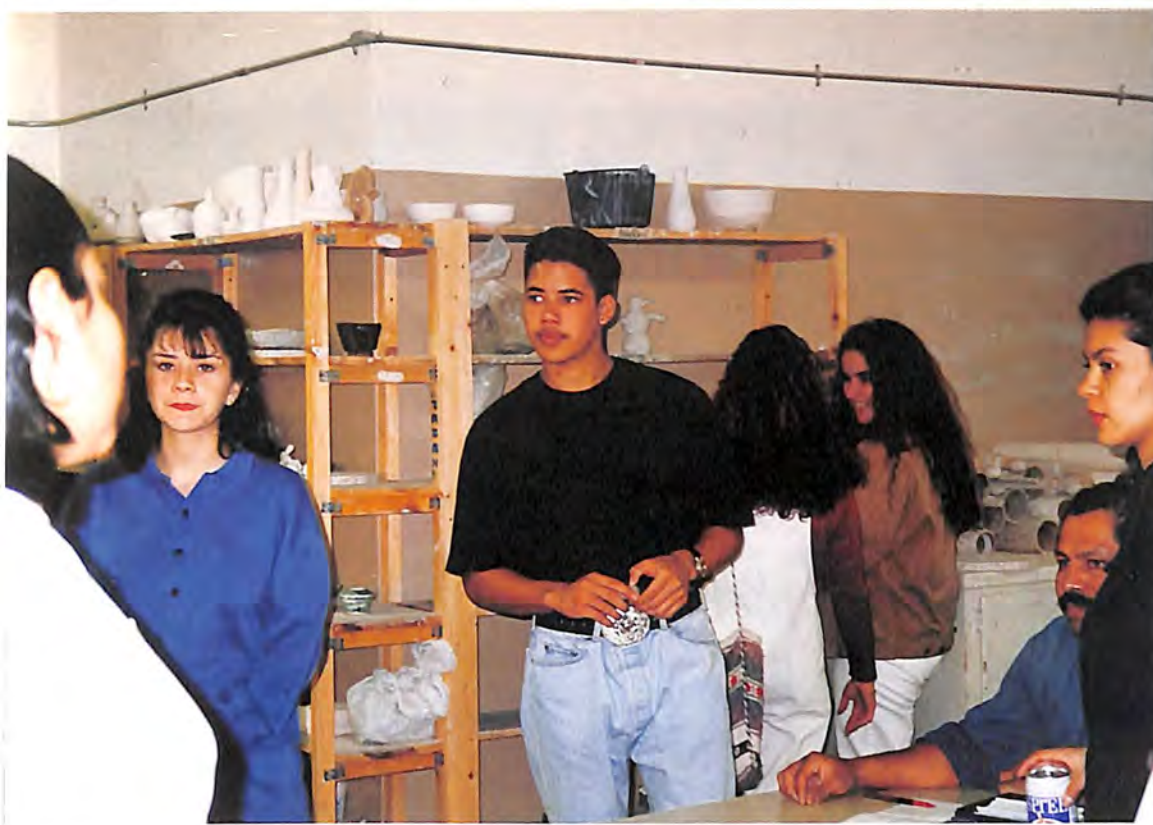

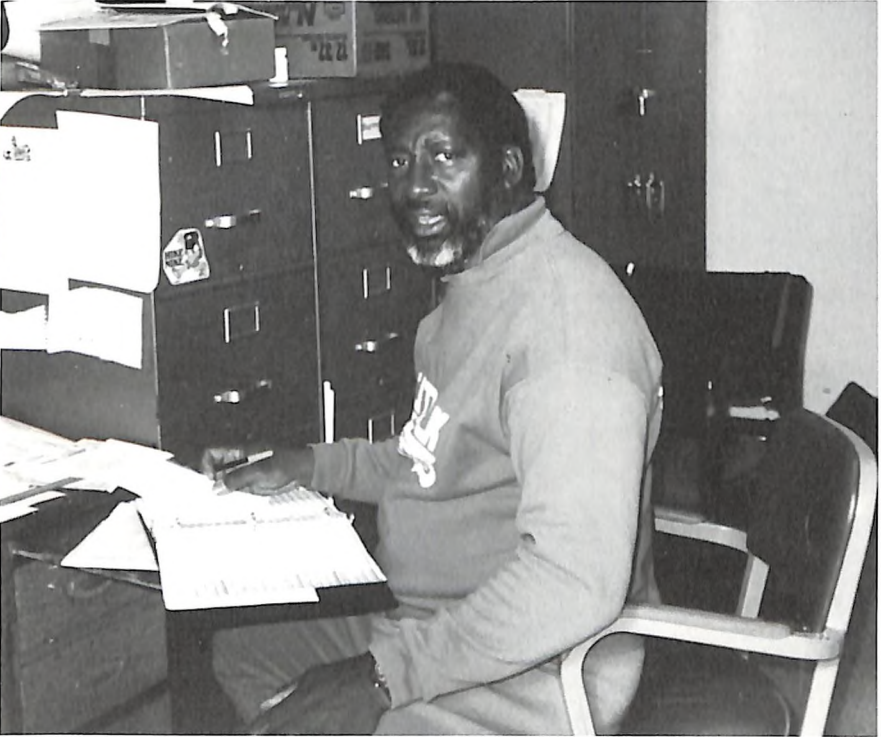
Ballard Talks Softly And Carries A Big Stick

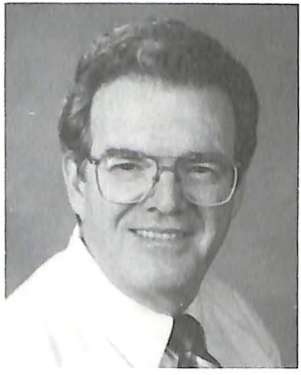
