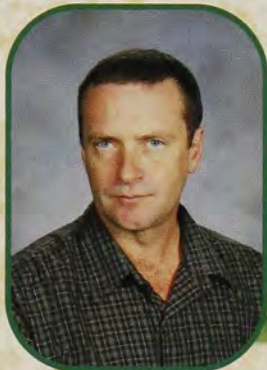

Mrs. Bryant was ecstatic in finding out that she was chosen out of 80,000 teachers in the Los Angeles County to become teacher of the year. The giant cardboard check included a set of golden digits reading \$1,000. This award was much appreciated by the dedicated teacher, who said the best thing about being a teacher of the year is "being able to reflect on what I've done in the last twenty years, and reflect on the lives I've been able to impact, which has been more rewarding to me than obtaining the title, "Teacher of the Year".

Aspiring to be a newscaster/sportscaster as a child, Mrs. Bryant soon found her niche as she came to MHS and taught Government, Economics, Psychology, and started a Peer Helping Program. She says, "I decided to become a teacher, because I know it is what I was meant to do and I love that I can contribute positively to individual lives and to our society as a whole."

Mrs. Bryant, an alumni of the school who attended in the 80s, and whose eldest son of three children attends MHS as a Freshman this year, cannot wait for all of the construction to be done and see the finished product. Although the eighties were some time ago, Mrs. Bryant appreciates that Monrovia has kept its small town feel, where people have a place to belong, and that the diversity of the people has stayed the same.

After high school, Mrs. Bryant went to UCLA where she majored in Psychology and got her masters in education. Yet school is not the only thing on her mind. As she has been around town for a while now, Mrs. Bryant has taught teachers like Mrs. Bushnell at Santa Fe Middle School, and Ms. Shiber in her Madquins Club at Monrovia High School. She also has known Ms. Gates since she was about eleven, and used to see Ms. Hart on a daily basis at her volleyball practices.

Besides attending MHS, Mrs. Bryant has also contributed to it by being an adviser to several clubs over the years, participating in student events like student vs. teacher sports, chaperoning dances, and by participating in assemblies and recognition rallies for students.

Yet, aside from all of the titles: Teacher of the Year, Club Advisor, Coach, Teacher, Alumni, Mom, and Wife, Jennifer Bryant contributes to the school by making students feel like they are an important part of this school, winning her true title, Individual of the Year.
