Wildcat Varsity Boasts Eleven Returning Lettermen

Tonight with help from Chaffey's Tigers, the Monrovia-Duarte High Wildcats kick off the local prep football campaign. This will be the second in a series of season-opening contests between the Wildcats and Tigers. Last year at Chaffey the 'Cat rolled to an easy 33-6 victory.

Although a few key players, the like of Evie Adams, Walt Senior, Gus Goller, and Larry Chaffers are missing from tonight's Green and White roster, Chaffey will have to deal with practically the same squad they faced last fall. No less than eleven varsity lettermen have returned to Coaches Claude "Dink" Walker and John Daniels.

Standout among these are Hardiman Cureton and Roy Gaebel. Cureton's 235 pounds of swiftly moving mayhem are ready again to make themselves felt in the backfield of the opposition. Cureton's brilliant line play last fall resulted in his being named to the right tackle position of the All-CIF team.

Fullback Gaebel is another big and fast gent. He can back his 190 pounds the length of the gridiron as fast as anyone in the CIF today. Last spring he placed fourth in both the CIF 100 and 220 yard dashes.

The Wildcat personnel you may have seen, but their offensive style is new. You will often see the 'Cat ends split out ten yards from the tackles and the halfbacks flanked outside the ends instead of the straight T-formation used by Coach Walker last fall. This indicates a more wide open Wildcat attack than ever before.

Chaffey Tigers Out To Reverse Scores

The Wildcats had a comparatively easy time with Chaffey last fall in the opener of the practice season, but tonight Chaffey is intent on reversing the result of last year's tussle which found the Greenmen on top of the Tigers, 33-6.

Last year was an unusual one for Chaffey rooters. The Orange and Black failed to win the Citrus Belt bunting. It was only the second time in five campaigns that the Tigers were not champions. Folks out Ontario way want another winning football team.

With thirteen varsity lettermen returning, championship thoughts at Chaffey may not be too far out of line. The Tigers will undoubtedly use a more simplified offense—a straight single wing—instead of the combination T and single wing of last fall.

Veterans Monte Shipps, Bob Grimmesey, and Don Vick will carry the brunt of the Tiger ball totting duties. Behind Vick in the fullback spot is letterman Warren Hawley. Another monogram winner, Tony Malone, will be back to relieve Shipps and Grimmesey of some of their halfback chores.

Five more lettermen will start in the Orange and Black line. Ends Bob Smith and Roger Bartlett, Tackle Jim Bare, Guard Julian Mercado, and Center Duane Sims are all holdover from last year's squad.

Reports from Ontario tab two Bee gridders as good varsity first string material. One of these, Guard Lee Riggs, will start for the Tigers tonight. The other touted Bee prospect is Halfback Sammy Crowe.

Truck Lindsey Coaches Tigers

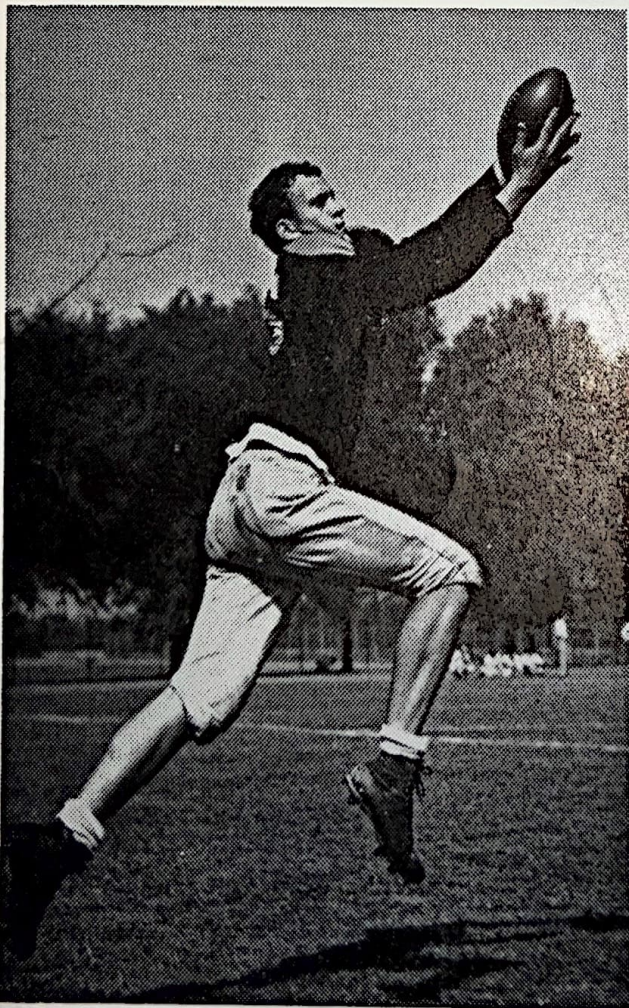
The Chaffey Tigers are more than adequately coached by Coach Truscott ("Truck") Lindsey, who has been Tiger coach for past five years.

Chaffey Tiger Ends In Action

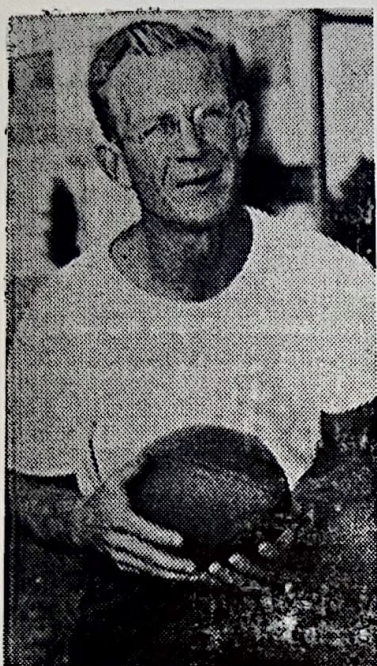


No. 84, Bob Smith, starts tonight at L. E.

Dink Walker Leads Wildcats



In this, the first program of the 1951 season, it is fitting that the man responsible for the destiny of the Green and White gridders be honored.

Coach Claude "Dink" Walker graduated from Whittier College in 1930 where he was a three-year letter winner in both football and basketball. Incidentally, the nickname "Dink" was pinned on Coach Walker when he reported for football as a high school freshman, weighing a heavy 87 pounds and standing 5 feet 2 inches tall.

While in college Walker was named to the all conference team twice and received Little All American honorable mention. He called signals and ran at the left half-back spot.

In 1930, upon graduation from Whittier College, Dink accepted his first coaching position at M.A.D., where he taught for two years. His first year he was backfield coach for the varsity. His 1931 Bee team was defeated by Muir High for the championship, 6-4. He was also head varsity basketball coach and his team won the Foothill League championship.

Walker next coached at Whittier in 1941, when he accepted the backfield coaching job at Whittier College. The team won the conference championship that season.

In 1942 Dink went to Tulare high school as dean of boys and coach. He coached football and basketball, winning one championship in the former and two titles in the latter.

In 1945 he moved to Santa Paula high school as counselor, student body advisor, and coach of football and basketball. When Walker took over the Santa Paula football team it had not won a game in four years. During his four years in Santa Paula, his football teams won three league titles and played in the C.I.F. playoffs against South Pasadena twice, losing the first 27-26 and the second 26-13. His 1948 team won the C.I.F. northern division small schools title. Coaching "B" basketball for three years, his teams won three league titles.

Walker's record at M.A.D. has been 12 wins and six losses in two years. He is not only head football coach but is also director of all athletics and head of the boys' physical education department.

When asked for a statement on this year's prospects, Coach Walker had the following to say:

"I never predict the number of games my teams will win or lose. I think the general public has a tendency to place too much emphasis on winning and losing. Interscholastic athletics were not developed with that philosophy in mind.

"I have three questions to be answered when I start coaching a team: (1) Does the team look well coached on the field? (2) Do the boys play up to their capabilities? (3) Are they respected for their ability and clean play by the teams they meet? If, at the end of the season I can answer yes to these three questions, I consider the season a success regardless of the won, loss record."
