HOW TO MARK YOUR FAVORITE FISHIN HOLE



Hundreds of people ask me this question each year. My favorite answer is, "I put an X on the water when I fished here the last time!" or "I put an X on my boat to mark the spot".

Marker buoys are an indispensable tool once you get on a spot, but they aren't really necessary if you know your **RIFLE SIGHTS**. If you fish a lake that has a lot of fishing pressure and you throw out a yellow marker buoy, you might just as well run up a yellow flag and start yelling, "The fish are over here". You'll have lots of competition.

When you have competition on the lake you're fishing, you're better off relying on **rifle sights** to stay on your spots. Line up shoreline objects, one behind the other; the left edge of a dock and the right side of the picture window on the brown house; the big rock on the water's edge and the large white pine, 100 feet behind it, in the white house's yard.

Two rifle sights at approximately a right angle will always do the trick. You can also use one rifle sight and your locator if there is a quick drop or depth change that you are familiar with.



Once you've learned to use rifle sights you can always return to your favorite fishing hole, unless the house burns down or someone cuts your marker tree down. (This has happened to me several times.)

APRIL FISHING

Game fish season for all practical purposes is closed in our area at this time, with the exception of the five lake project just off Hwy M in Boulder Junction, where the season never closes. **Escanaba Lake**, one of the five lake project, is a good place to test your open water skills before the start of the state open water season. Walleye, northern musky and panfish are all present. If you're looking for smallmouth you can try **Nebish Lake** which is right next door. Remember to pick up your free fishing permit at the Escanaba station before fishing in any of the five lake project lakes.

Normally by the end of April our ice is completely gone, and crappies and perch are the prime targets of most fishermen in this area.

Weather is the all-determining factor of where and how the panfish are biting. If extremely warm or above normal the last week of April can be some of the best crappie fishing of the season. Crappies move into the shallows shortly after ice out and can be very aggressive and fun to catch.

An ultra-lite spinning rod & reel, fly rod or even a 12' to 14' cane pole will do. Replace the mono line on your spinning reels with fresh 4# or 6# test mono. (Your line is the cheapest part of your fishing arsenal and the most often overlooked.) It's normally on sale for a penny a yard this time of year.

Small 1/64 - 1/32 or 1/16 oz. tube jigs, maribou jigs, twister tails, beetle spins and willie worms are the hot baits to use in an assortment of colors. White, pink/white or yellow/white are my favorites and normally produce some nice slabs. It always pays to experiment with different colors. A bucket of crappie minnows and small #6 or #8 hooks with a bobber is also a must for spring crappies.

Some good choices for spring crappie are **Round, Little Crooked, High and Upper Gresham Lakes** in Boulder Junction, **Wild Rice, Fawn and Clear Lake** in Manitowish Waters, **Van Vliet Lake** in Winchester-Presque Isle, **Echo, Cedar and Flambeau Flowage** in Mercer, and **Pokegama, Flambeau and Gunlock Lake** in Lac du Flambeau.

Crappies are fun to catch and great eating! So get your gear ready, load up the kids and head North for some fun spring fishing.

1990 VILAS COUNTY MUSKY MARATHON

The 1990 Vilas County Musky Marathon tallied 2,033 muskies, with a combined weight of 26,173 pounds and a total length of 6,276 feet. Of the total registered, 1,353 were released for the future enjoyment of others.

If you would like to find out where the meeting in your county is, call your local Hdqts. of the Wisconsin Dept. of Natural Resources or if you would like to obtain a copy of proposed questions write: **Bureau of Information and Education, D.N.R., PO Box 7921, Madison WI 53707. Phone 608-266-6790**

One of the more controversial questions will be the proposed muskellunge size limit. The D.N.R. wishes to establish a base of **36" as a statewide minimum length**. In category two, they wish to establish a **40" minimum length on specified waters (D.N.R. fish managers have listed 40 lakes in Vilas county alone)**. Last, but not least, they would have special regulations with a 32" size limit on a limited number of waters with documented growth problems or **45" "trophy only" size limit of which they are recommending Trout Lake in Vilas County.**

For 1991 we already have three lakes in our area that will be 40". They are Big Lake on Hwy. K and Allequash Lake on Hwy. M. in Vilas County and Moose Lake in Iron County north of Mercer

If you are for or against the proposed changes, you can have your say and cast your vote the end of April. If you don't vote, you have no one to blame but yourself!




