MUNICIPAL SWIMMING POOL AND BATHHOUSE
FOLEY, ALABAMA

The bathhouse is entered at the center, immediately in front of which is the check room where tickets are purchased and baskets for checking clothes are obtained. The women bathers go to the right as they enter the building and change their clothes in a dressing room which has individual showers and dressing stalls which give the bathers privacy. The dressing room is finished with glazed tile walls and unglazed ceramic tile floors. The dressing booths are steel.


Public restrooms for men and women are located in the right of the building with entrances from the outside.

The men and boys enter the building going to the left and their dressing room is also with glazed tile and unglazed ceramic tile on the floor with a tile shower room. The room on the extreme left end of the bathhouse with the double doors houses the water treatment plant, including diatomite filters and chlorinator.

This pool is "T" shaped with 6 seven foot swimming lanes running the length of the top of the "T", which is 45 ft. wide and 90 ft. long. This area varies in depth from 3 ft. at each end to 4½ ft. in the center. The lower part of the "T" is 35 ft. by 35 ft. with 12 ft. deep under the three-meter and the one-meter board. A life line with floats separates the diving area from the swimming area. Seventy-seven percent of the water area is wadable or under 4½ ft. deep. The pool has limestone curb and gutter, marble dust finish on the walls and floor, and tile swimming lane markers. The entire pool is enclosed with a 7 ft. chain link fence.

A 20 ft. by 30 ft. wading pool with a 6 ft. concrete walk and enclosed with a 3 ft. chain link fence provides a protected area for small children. A shelter 30 ft. by 50 ft. located outside the fenced enclosure adjacent to the wading and swimming pools provides protection for the spectator from the sun during the hot part of the day.

The diving area is in the center foreground and the swimming area is to the left of the diving area. The left part of the "T" is not shown in the picture.

The photograph was taken from the top of a shelter, 30 ft. by 50 ft. with reinforced concrete floor and roof which adjoins the pool but is outside the fence enclosure.

Adjacent to the shelter is a wading pool, 20 ft. by 30 ft., encircled with a 6 ft. concrete walk and is also enclosed with a 3 ft. chain link fence.

This pool is located in the middle of an eleven acre park. It is proposed that a combination community center and city auditorium be developed in the park adjacent to the swimming pool.

BALDWIN COUNTY

Trainloads of early Irish potatoes will be moving from Baldwin County within a week, and by the end of the season it is expected that approximately 5,000 carloads will be shipped to the nation's produce centers.

Alabamians should know more about Baldwin County. Its agricultural income, or rather the agricultural income of the Southern half of the county, is derived chiefly from truck crops, a major portion of which is shipped to the Northern and Eastern States. Besides Irish potatoes, sweet corn, "white" or New Jersey sweet potatoes, cucumbers and watermelons are produced in abundance, and in addition a large volume of satsumas and other citrus fruits.

An Associated Press dispatch from Baldwin recently said that the farmers of the county received more money than the farmers of any county in the United States. Because of its climate, Baldwin is ideally suited to grow many early vegetable crops which cannot be produced in other sections.

Baldwin County farmers have been among the most progressive in the State. They have a high average cash income, but the type of farming they do also requires large outlays for equipment, fertilizer, labor, etc. The farmers of that section have made it one of the State's most valuable assets.

Speaking of the complex issues that must be dealt with by citizens in a democracy and pointing out that the means of controlling economic and political trends is in the hands of a few, the Lynds comment: "Herein one glimpses once more the possible seeds of an eventual coercive control which in Europe today goes under the name of fascism."

The fear of fascism in the United States today is not as pronounced as in 1935. There were many who read "It Can't Happen Here" and were frightened by the spectre of Senator Windrip and his Minut Men. But many events of importance have taken place since then. Senator Long is dead. Roosevelt was reelected with more solid support than any had thought possible. The emergence of John L. Lewis and the upholding of the Wagner act are events which are pointed to as both sure signs of fascism and guarantees against it.

Perhaps the Lynds will again assemble their staff in 1945 and return to Middletown, if our democracy still prevails, to tell us why and how we crossed the bridges that are ahead. Meanwhile those who have the courage will have peered through the microscope of "Middletown in Transition" which is in reality America in transition.

NO FLOOD EPIDEMICS

One of the most serious hazards that follow in the wake of floods is that of epidemics. The floods which covered vast areas in the Ohio Valley this year were particularly dangerous in this respect since some of the sections which were inundated had not suffered from floods in many years, and hence the residents were not experienced in dealing with the hazards that follow when the waters go down.

The Food and Drug Administration of the Federal government reports that not a single outbreak of communicable diseases followed in the wake of this year's floods. Chief credit for this record, the agency believes, is due to the strict adherence to the regulations regarding the use of foods which might be polluted.

Inspectors for the administration destroyed or condemned for human consumption hundreds of carloads of foods which had been soaked by the floods. Sales were forbidden to sell damaged goods where there was any possibility that cholera or dysentery might be spread.

A report of the administration cites the prevention of the processing of 120 tons of coffee which had been soaked by the flood waters. In one community 200 carloads of food were dumped and the National Guard was called upon to keep scavengers from taking away the condemned food.

The economic loss was considerable, of course, but it was more than compensated for in the safe-guarding of thousands of lives which would have been endangered had rigid restrictions not been enforced.

The Administration seemingly holds a faith. Failing that somewhat improbable contingency, it is not easy at present to discern other important risk in the operation. Nevertheless, there are times in which we are said of the world that which used to be said of Ireland, namely, that the inevitable will happen and the impossible will happen frequently!—Wall Street Journal.

GOOD LUCK IN GALLSTONES

Demand from China and Japan for gall from American cattle has reached a point where workers in slaughter houses now are cautiously on the lookout for these "precious" stones. In Chicago's packing house district, such stones bring approximately \$100 a pound. The stones received so far was \$375 a pound. These are highly prized by superstitious Orientals and are used as charm pieces. They fashion them into expensive lockets and amulets which are worn next to their bodies to ward off evil. It is said that nearly every Chinese soldier carries a gallstone charm to protect himself from an enemy. They are also said to be used for medicinal purposes to cure some of the plagues and ailments that afflict the Orient.—Wall Street Journal.
