

As you probably know, at the request of Mr. H. F. Lee, Associate Member, Alabama Public Service Commission, and on behalf of the citizens of Foley, some months ago we sent one of our representatives (Mr. W. S. Webb) to Foley to make a survey of the situation to see whether or not there was sufficient needs for a commercial telegraph service to justify our building into your city and opening an office.

On Mr. Webb's report, I recommend to our higher executives that we extend our lines to Foley and open an office there.

Am glad to advise you that my recommendation has been approved. The material is being ordered and the work of building our lines into your city will be expedited as much as possible.

Will you please make known to the users of the telegraph and the people generally interested, our decision in the matter?

He is an epileptic case as well as mental. His mother is dead and his father a common laborer with very little initiative. The boy lives with an aged grandmother who is completely blind. Carl is becoming a greater problem daily because he cannot (at his age now) be confined to his home. He wanders the streets and will undoubtedly be killed or cause some one serious injury.

Is there some way at your earliest convenience that something can be done to place Carl in an institution?
